The statement is prepared to assist the Securities Broker to meet the requirements of the SECP, Pakistan Stock Exchange (PSX) and National Clearing Company of Pakistan Limited (NCCPL). As a result, the statement may not be suitable for another purpose. Our report is intended solely for the Securities Broker, SECP, PSX and NCCPL and should not be distributed to parties other than the Securities Broker or the SECP, PSX or NCCPL. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.
